The Little Bear Video...*just a reminder...*

On Tuesday, April 11th, we will have a parent in-service for the video Little Bear. This video is a nationally recognized video featuring animal characters

to teach children ways to avoid being sexually abused. The tape features Little Bear, who has been touched in a way he is not comfortable with and told not to "tell." But he does "tell" and then learns about good touch and bad touch and ways to say no. The video will be shown to the children on Wednesday, April 12th (3-day classes) and Thursday, April 13th (2-day classes). The preview showing of the tape will be held for parents only on Tuesday, April 11th, beginning at 6:30 p.m. We want very much for you to have an opportunity to view it, and be best prepared for any further discussion that may happen in your home on the days following the video. We use this video each year and have found it extremely well done.
**The Little Bear character in this video is NOT the same as Little Bear from the Else Holmelund Minarik/Maurice Sendak books and videos.
